Soaking in the Dew Slow Down, Be Still

"Welcome to Wesley! We're so glad you're here"... is the greeting Kimberly and I have received countless times since arriving at the beginning of July. We are so grateful for your kindness since then and are glad we are here too!

I was preparing for our weekly staff devotion last week, and it occurred to me that we are quickly approaching the 'dog days of summer'. Soon vacations will give way to school preparation, trips to the pool or beach will become less frequent, and the weather will begin to cool. As I was reflecting on the shortening vacation season, I realized that Kimberly and I have yet to take a summer break. Of course this summer has been a little busy with the move and all, but I think it's still important to take a few days just to get away from the routine of daily life and to rest. So, as my mind began to ponder when and where we could vacation, I ran across the following words of wisdom from L. B. Cowman's Streams in the Desert:

Beloved fellow worker, you recognize the folly of a laborer attempting to work all day without eating, but do you recognize the folly of a servant of God attempting to minister without eating of the heavenly manna? Neither is it sufficient to have spiritual nourishment only occasionally. Every day you must receive the "renewal by the Holy Spirit." You know the difference between your whole being pulsating with the energy and freshness of God's divine life or feeling worn-out and weary. Quietness and stillness bring the dew. At night when the leaves and grass are still, the plants' pores are open to receive the refreshing and invigorating bath. And spiritual dew comes from quietly lingering in the Master's presence. Get still before Him, for haste will prevent you from receiving the dew. Wait before God until you feel saturated with His presence. Then move on to your next duty with the awareness of the freshness and energy of Christ. ... Dew will never appear while there is either heat or wind. The temperature must fall, the wind cease, and the air come to a point of coolness and rest—absolute rest—before the invisible particles of moisture will become dew to dampen any plant or flower. And the grace of God does not come forth to bring rest and renewal to our soul until we completely reach the point of stillness before Him. (Cowman 79)

Fellow workers in God's kingdom, I hope you'll be encouraged by the words Cowman chose to make her point, because they are good words indeed—we need rest. Rest is healthy for our bodies, our minds, our productivity, our relationships, etc. It's also necessary for our souls. God created us to take a break every now and again (Exodus 20:8-11). So, as we enter the final weeks of this summer, I ask you, "When was the last time you took a break? And, how did you reconnect with God during that time?" God longs to provide our souls rest. Won't you take a break with God?

Wesley Financial Update

General fund receipts as of 6/30/17 \$ 673,734 General fund expenses as of 6/30/17 640,036

Surplus \$ 33,698

If you looked at our year-to-date financial update last month, you saw a surplus of \$66,524. As you can see from the above figures, that surplus was nearly cut in half in one month! Some of the June deficit was due to a few one-time needs and timing of expenses during the month, but part of it was also due to lower than normal offerings. Fortunately, we had a surplus from earlier in the year to carry us through.

Please remember, as you take a well-deserved break from the hectic schedules of the school year, that the Church's expenses continue all year long. We anticipate lower expenses in July, then will need to get back on track by August to restart fall ministry programs. Statements were recently mailed so that you can see if you are on track with your financial commitment for 2017.

Thank you for your continued prayers, your presence, your gifts and your service.


