# Brother Louie's Car Horn

There is a Garrison Keillor story I like which came out of his many years as radio host for "Prairie Home Companion". It is the story of a mythical Lake Wobegon resident named "Brother Louie":

"Brother Louie had a car which was a rolling display of Scriptural truths. Not only did his license plate display a verse of Scripture, but additional ones were plastered all over the inside of his car – across the dashboard, both sun visors, the back of the front seat, the ashtray and glove compartment. But the best thing about Brother Louie's car was its horn, which played the first eight notes of the Doxology (the song we sing when we receive each Sundays' offering)..."

"It sounded like a trumpet. Louie blew it at pedestrians, oncoming traffic, while passing, sometimes just for his own pleasure. On occasion, vexed by a fellow driver, Louie gave in to wrath and leaned on the horn, only to hear "Praise God, from whom all blessings flow..." Keillor says, "It calmed him right down".

Keeping a doxology – a word of praise to God for the blessings that are constantly flowing into our lives but which can often go undetected by us –that is a consistent instruction found in the Bible. "Rejoice in the Lord always", St. Paul would tell the early church, "and again I say, 'rejoice'.

And what I find remarkable about Paul's insistence on being always ready with your doxology is that it is not to be only a response to good times and happy days. Many of the strongest injunctions to praise in Paul's life were written when life was hard and harsh, even when he was in prison, chained to a wall, and unsure if he would ever be free again. In his way of seeing things, we are called to embody a defiant doxology or word of praise regardless of the circumstances of the moment. "I know what it is to have plenty," he would say, "And I know what it is to be in want. I am ready for anything through him who strengthens me."

Like most anything worthwhile, to live like that does take some effort and practice. The theologian Parker Palmer reminds us: It requires no special talent or effort to look at our world and point out the things that numb us, or dumb us down, or depress us. But becoming keenly and consistently aware of what's good, true, beautiful, and life-giving around us and within us demands a discipline: we must open our eyes, minds and hearts. And we must keep them open.

Summer time, with its slightly slower pace and increased opportunity for time outside, is a good time to recommit to living with open eyes, minds and hearts. Join us in church this summer, as we cultivate our inner doxology, and our capacity to respond with joy to the gifts of life which are unfolding all around us.

# Wesley Financial Update



Such is the construction on the second floor of the church this summer, as an original ceiling is replaced in the hallway, along with light fixtures and other necessary infrastructure. As messy and noisy as it may be during the work phase, it will be another beautifully renovated area in a short while. Projects such as this one are made possible because of the generosity of those who have left a legacy gift to the church upon their passing. The funds from such gifts are used for building improvements or other projects carefully considered and evaluated by the church's Board of Trustees. Your benevolence when preparing your will can also make a difference in future building renovations of the church.

Old, worn ceiling tiles from the late 1950's, early 1960's will be replaced upstairs during construction. The uneven, bumpy, tiles will have new energy efficient replacements soon.




