Please feel free to join us for all or portions of the day as you are able.



### Wesley Financial Update

Surplus \$ 19,072

The Trustees have recently approved updating the sound and video equipment used in Wesley Hall. Several groups use this equipment on a regular basis, such as WISE on Sunday mornings, youth on Wednesday evenings, the recent Lenten lunch series, UMW presentations, and other activities. The old equipment was becoming less reliable and troublesome to use due to the age of the equipment. Using funds budgeted annually for large projects, the Trustees will be able to provide a new projector, updated controls and screen, and more reliable equipment.

Much thought and discussion goes into the decisions on how to best spend these limited project funds each year. Other recent upgrades have included replacement of sanctuary microphones due to changes in FCC regulations, repairs to HVAC equipment, replacement of a freezer compressor, and pump and drainage work. Last year's projects also included a new drop ceiling on the second floor, and landscaping work along Front and McLean Streets, including curb replacements.






