A Note from Our Pastor

Beautiful Star of Bethlehem – Your Light Has Come!

I don't know if you know this about me, but I'm an early riser. I usually get up before 5:00 am and head to the gym before Andy gets up in the morning. I lay out my

clothes ahead of time and try very hard to move quietly in the darkness so I don't wake him. But more often than not, the darkness of the room causes me to bump the furniture, kick the wastebasket, or run into the door frame on the way to the bathroom. Yesterday I kicked the cat's bowl and spilled water all over the bathroom floor. Ugh. So much for quiet! I've even got a couple of annoying bruises from trying to navigate the house in the darkness! I keep thinking, why don't we put a nightlight in the bedroom so I can find my way?

As the world pulls down the Christmas lights and packs them away for another year, God sends a special new light to shine in the darkness and help us find our way in the dark. We call it the Star of Bethlehem. This is the star that guided the Wise Men to the Christ Child, which the Church celebrates on January 6, a day called "Epiphany." Epiphany means "Manifestation." Christ was manifested, revealed, not only to his own people, but to travelers from far away, whose race, religion and language were different from his own. The light of this special Star shone across the earth, lit up their path and led them to Jesus. John 1:5 tells us that the light of Christ "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Think about that. As soon as one candle, one flashlight, one bulb comes to life, a pitch-dark room is no longer pitch-dark. It only takes one light to poke a hole in the darkness. And no one can bring enough darkness to hide it. St. Francis of Assisi is credited with saying, "all the darkness in the world cannot extinguish the light of one small candle." Francis probably had a nightlight in his bathroom.

So before you put away all the candles and lights this year – be grateful for the way they have poked holes in your darkness. You might even leave a couple of candles out for the rest of the winter, to remember the Star of Bethlehem and the Light of Christ. Walk in safety, friends, and don't stumble. Let your light shine for others,

so they can walk well, too. - Pastor Sara Isbell
