A Note From from Pastor Sara I See You; I Hear You; I Feel You; I Get You. RESPONSES TO GENERAL CONFERENCE 2019

On April 12, 39 of us gathered in the Wesley Hall to talk about the results of General Conference 2019, and how

Wesley Church members might respond. It was a very good meeting. The group represented a variety of ages (*approx. 30-80*) and perspectives. We worked under the "RESPECT" guidelines we've used in other settings (*www.umcdiscipleship.org/ resources/eric-laws-respectful-communication-guidelines*). And we shared with each other honestly and honorably. In some ways, that was the purpose of the evening: to practice honest and respectful conversation with one another. Continuing this kind of practice, whether in response to a significant event, in preparation for one, or simply to strengthen our relationships and health as a congregation, will be an ongoing opportunity with priceless rewards. Taking time to be with each other, to share a meal together, and to not be afraid to talk about tough topics, regardless of whether we agree or disagree – that's a healthy thing for a church like ours! Our hope is to be able to say:

I see you – often persons who feel themselves in the "minority" for one reason or another feel invisible. They believe their only options are to speak out, and risk alienating relationships, or to stay silent and keep their feelings hidden. When we gather together and acknowledge each other in the room, we say, "I see you. You are here, and you matter." *I see you* also enables us to talk "with each other" rather than "about each other," according to biblical principles (Matthew 18). *I hear you* – sometimes we "listen" to others speak, but only well enough to prepare our own rebuttal, to catch a few key words that we can push back against when it's our turn to talk. That's not really listening. To say, "I hear you" is to say, "I really want to understand where you're coming from. Thank you for being vulnerable enough to tell me."

I feel you – I learned this phrase from my millennial children. It sounds awkward to me, but I think it's an expression of empathy. I care enough about your feelings to want to feel them with you. I want to understand where you're coming from. *I get you* – To say you "get it" is to say you can say it back to the other person and receive their affirmation – *yes!* – *that's what it's like to be me!* It's not easy to "get" someone if you've never actually walked in their shoes. But the more we listen, the more we try, the closer we come to truly understanding, and the closer we come to reconciliation and peace.

The work we began on April 12 is just a first step. Seeing, hearing, feeling and "getting" each other doesn't necessarily mean we agree with each other, or that we see eye-to-eye. But it does mean we embrace each other, heart-to-heart. This is an important value for us, not only at this moment in the church's life, but anytime we face change or challenge. I want to thank all those who participated in the conversation, and all those who will participate in the future. 


