We are proud to be the home of this play-based school that is a resource to many families in our community (both members of our congregation and non-members are welcome), and we strive to provide a convenient, affordable preschool curriculum to help little ones prepare for elementary school. Our program boasts multi-age learning, tailored to the unique needs of each child beginning with our toddlers through pre-K (ages 1 thru 5).

Our Bright Beginnings staff believe a love of learning starts early, and the most effective way to teach our young ones is learning through play. WBB offers a safe, fun and nurturing environment with activities designed to develop skills that ultimately lead to success in the classroom. Daily activities are consistent and structured, mirroring what a child might experience in "big kid" school (i.e. kindergarten culture). Children enjoy a mix of structured activities, free play, stories, drama, crafts and music provided by loving and dedicated teachers. WBB graduates emerge from our preschool with confidence and readiness to succeed at the next level.

- Social Skills:** Self-confidence, independence, group participation, following instructions, sharing, taking turns and manners.

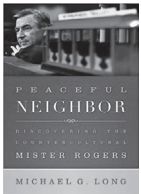

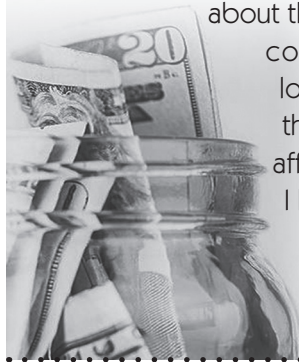
