As I've been encouraging others to send in their testimonies about why Wesley UMC has become their beloved church home, I thought maybe I should set a good example and send one in, myself! My word is "Abundant"! Wesley is a place of abundant gifts and blessings; if you've never worshiped anywhere else, you may not realize just how uniquely this church overflows with blessing and potential!



- I see it in worship in the amazing music we have here, and the way that every Sunday is Special Music Sunday!
- I see it in mission the way the "Just One" bin is often quite literally overflowing, and the diapers, wipes and paper towels at Wesley West are stacked so high, they keep falling off the tables.
- I see it in discipleship the way there are more Bible study and small group opportunities going on than anybody has time to attend.
- I see it in our financial stewardship the way, despite economic uncertainty in our society, we always have enough to pay the bills, compensate our staff, and still have enough left over for new ministries.
- I see it in our volunteerism how Wesley members freely share their time and talent with others.
- I see it in Christian compassion the way people care for each other, in good times and bad.

Recently, I've seen abundance in some pretty dramatic and powerful ways:

- When Molly (our receptionist) went on maternity leave, a dozen volunteers stepped up to help in the office this summer.

- When both Stacy and Frank "graduated" from our youth program at the same time, a dozen parents and youth leaders stepped up to keep SURGE running and to care for our youth as they begin a new year.
- · You can probably think of even more examples!

Remember how Jesus blessed five loaves and two fish, and somehow managed to feed 5000? That's abundance! That's what I experience here at Wesley UMC! My testimony is probably different from yours, because the "reason" I came to Wesley is that I was appointed. But my reasons for LOVING it – and loving you! – are ABUNDANT! Ministry Making a Difference

We have been quite busy this summer distributing our paper products AND helping our friends at the Tinervin Foundation distribute food boxes to our families. The food boxes have been an important addition to our monthly distribution. However, it has taken extra hands to assist our guests with all they now have to carry. We are so grateful for the extra volunteers who have turned out to lend a helping hand. We are now averaging 42 volunteers each month! In fact, since we started this program in January 2018, we have had over 200 individuals who have volunteered! It's amazing what Wesley continues to do to reach those in our community who have so little. Many volunteers come each month, some bring visiting friends and family from out-of-town, some bring kids and grandkids, ALL are welcome and have found JOY in serving! Have you volunteered at one of our events yet?

One of our newest volunteers shared as she rushed past me to help another guest, "I love this!" Several of our patrons have also shared that our Wesley crew is "the friendliest people we've met." So bring a smile and join us the 3rd Saturday of each month at Wesley West! Why?

- We serve over 200 families in just 2 hours each month (we are busy)!
- Those 200 families represent over 1,000 family members!
- Paper goods including diapers and feminine hygiene products are not available through the SNAP program.

If the facts above don't convince you how important this ministry is, consider this fact: Over the first year of a baby's life they can use as much as 2,500 diapers and wipes (WOW)! What an important resource we are to families in need! Wesley is, indeed, a generous church! In August, we had diapers and wipes donated by participants in our Vacation

Bible School, we received a \$250 grant to purchase diaper wipes through the Thrivent Program, and our congregation continues to fill the WDM box with paper products each month. Thank you for your donations, service, and prayers!



Disciple FAST-TRACK: — The New Testament-

Do you ever wish you knew the Bible a little bit better? Wonder whether there's anything in these ancient stories that actually applies to you? Disciple Fast-Track is a fantastic opportunity to get to know the stories of the Bible better, and to discover what this amazing collection of writings has to say about following Jesus as a disciple. This fall we are studying the New Testament together, and it's going to be great! The study will be 13 weeks, from Matthew through Revelation, and ending with an exploration of spiritual gifts.

Participants should expect to set aside 60-90 minutes a day for study and prayer, and block out Wednesday evenings at Wesley for a 90-minute class period. You'll get to know the context, the culture and the meaning of the gospels and letters for their original readers. Investing IN A Bright Future IN ZIMBABWE. Photo Credit: Sandi Hinrichs

This past May, Wesley members Sandi Hinrichs and Keith Smith traveled to the Fairfield Children's Home in Mutare, Zimbabwe, to offer much needed aid. Because of generous donations from our Wesley congregation, and funds raised by other mission volunteers, they presented \$2350 to the administrator, Ceceillia Thobani. These funds provided 54 new school uniforms, school supplies, a year's supply of laundry soap, mealy meal (corn meal product), powdered milk, rice, flour, frozen fish, and maize. An additional \$3750 was deposited in the Fairfield Children's Home bank account to be used in the future at their discretion. The team was also able to stay at Africa University and meet with several grateful students who have benefited from the scholarships our congregation has supported. While there, the mission team was also able to lend a hand in the construction of a house, the first of twenty, that will soon be home to one of the many farm workers and their families who live at the university and provide much of the food served to students and faculty.

Sandi's reflections: "I saw and experienced God's presence throughout our mission journey in Zimbabwe. He was there at Africa University, in the many students who shared their desire to return to their home countries and give back after receiving their degrees, in the farm workers who worshipped together before going to work, in the missionaries, Larry and Jane Kies, who poured love and care into the students they interacted with, and in the students and employees on campus who were warm and pleasant in all their interactions with us. I experienced God's presence in the young children at the Fairfield Children's Home who were hungry for attention, in the older children who watched over the little ones, in the house mothers who treated those in their care as if they were their own children, and in the administrator who worked tirelessly to provide care and safety for all who stayed at the facility. I saw God in the parishioners at the local church who welcomed our team to their worship service and explained what was being sung and said in the Shona language, in our tour guide/driver who joined in our prayers and devotions, in each of the mission volunteers as they supported each other and reached out to others around them, and in the incredible beauty of the wildlife and landscapes around us. Since the experience in Zimbabwe, I continue to see and feel God's presence here at home and am inspired to encourage others to look for Him in the people and world around them and to participate in future mission projects."











Keith's reflections: "For me personally, this was an opportunity to serve in a part of the world I have always wanted to visit. I feel truly blessed to be able to see the beautiful country of Zimbabwe, to meet so many wonderful people, and to participate in a project that changes lives is a gift from God. I felt my faith grow everyday in Africa in so many ways, and I will forever be grateful for the members of our team. As someone on the team said, God brings the right people together at the right time. And I am so thankful God chose me."

We applaud our beloved Wesley members, Sandi and Keith, and our entire congregation for their generous support of this mission, as we spread God's love throughout the world.
