a note From from Pastor Sara

What are we praying for? This past fall, we invited the congregation to help "create a legacy of generosity" at Wesley by making financial and prayer commitments for the coming year. You responded so generously (see the "Finance" article on page 6) – but not just with your finances. You responded generously with your prayers, too!

Perhaps you remember: two of the questions on the prayer card read, "My prayer for Wesley Church in the coming year is..." and "My prayer for Wesley in the next 5-10 years is...". The responses of this congregation to these two questions was truly inspiring.

in an invitation to "Share" – your faith, your journey, your church home.

• Our Lenten Worship series is entitled, "You Are Invited," and focuses on inviting others to be part of the Lenten journey.

• A really fun new Lenten study series, "Generous Hospitality at Work" includes movies and meals as a way to practice hospitality and welcome new friends.

2019 Year in Review: Our ministry continues to grow, both in guests who come for paper goods and volunteers who come to serve. We have just completed our 2nd full year of service. In this time, we were able to touch the lives of 1189 families, with over 5300 family members served! We have had over 198 volunteers, including 21 who were previous guests who returned to show their appreciation! We welcomed volunteers of ALL AGES including 25 elementary and high school students, many who have become regular volunteers. We have much to be grateful for. This has also proven to be a special year since establishing a partnership with The Tinervin Foundation. Their generosity not only supplies hundreds of food boxes each month, but they allow us to use their truck to help transport our

paper goods! We are so grateful and feel truly blessed in serving others! Our next endeavor is to place benches outside Wesley West to offer seating for both our patrons and community members waiting for the bus each day. We are SO excited about this project! Our distribution relies on the generous donations provided by our Wesley congregation and we are SO grateful! As we near the end of the year, we reflect on the many joys and challenges of the past year. For Wesley Church, challenges included several staff changes, loss of members due to deaths or moves, and news from the General Conference. However, those challenges have been balanced by the addition of wonderful new staff, birth of new babies and welcoming of new members, and the knowledge that Wesley continues to thrive in worship, music, missions, education, youth and other ministries. *How will next year compare?*

As of the print date of this newsletter, we received 235 financial commitment cards for 2020 for a total commitment of \$1,000,179 (about 83% of our current operating budget needs). Our Finance Committee will be meeting soon to determine how to adjust the current proposed budget by nearly \$200,000 so that we enter the new year with a balanced budget. As we work on determining other funding resources and cutting expenses where possible, we will also keep the mission of Wesley Church at the forefront of any decisions. After all, we are all here to make and nurture disciples for Jesus Christ. We have done an awesome job of that in the past year, and will no doubt do the same in 2020.
