LENTFORTY DAYS OF PREPARATION FOR Easter

March 1 will be the first Sunday of Lent. What is Lent all about?

The word "Lent" comes from the Old English, "lencten," which refers to the way the days "lengthen" in the springtime. It is no coincidence that Lent begins in winter and ends in spring as Easter bursts forth in living color. All creation bears witness to the power of resurrection, every single year. But before there can be a resurrection, we have to come to terms with death.

Lent is a time of recognizing our own mortality and sinful human nature. It is a time for prayer and repentance, and offering up to God the faults and failures that so easily hold us hostage to sin. Many Christians "give things up" for Lent – normally the temptations that come along with our natural human weakness: foods, drinks and bad habits that we know do not bring us closer to God.

Other Christians "take things on" for Lent – making a point to pray more regularly, read scripture more thoughtfully, serve more freely, give more generously, share more openly – in other words, the very spiritual exercises we've been practicing during "The Walk."

We would encourage you to continue exercising this Lenten season, and to make these five spiritual practices your Lenten discipline as you prepare yourself for Easter.

Why do we need to prepare for Easter? Because if we aren't prepared, we might miss it. If we haven't emptied ourselves of our own stuff, we will be too full to hunger for the Lord's Supper. If we haven't made space in our lives to walk with him, we may be too busy to answer when he knocks on our heart's door.

If we haven't thought about what it means to deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow him – we may miss the point of his sacrifice altogether, and show up Easter morning wondering what all the fuss is about.

Don't miss the best gift you'll ever be given. Start off the Lenten journey with your Wesley family, and let's walk to the cross together. MARK YOUR CALENDARS

a Note From from Pastor Justin

God in the Movies March 1st is the first Sunday in Lent this year. The season of Lent is a time of preparation and reflection before Easter. It emphasizes personal transformation, and often encourages believers to "give up"

a vice or bad habit, or "take on" a new spiritual practice, so as to discover God in a new way. So, in the spirit of "taking on" something new, Pastor Sara and I would like to invite you to the movies. But, there's a catch - we want you to bring a friend or two with you.

There are so many great reasons to go to movies. They're entertaining. They're relaxing. And that buttery popcorn (come on)! But frankly, the best part about going to the movies is going with friends. Actually, many of life's best moments happen when we spend time with others. That's why on Sunday mornings this Lent, Pastor Sara and I will share a sermon series that we're calling, Spoiler Alerts. It is our hope that through the six movies we're featuring in the series, we'll catch a glimpse of what it means to welcome and include others, as well as to invite others into Christian fellowship. Also, don't miss Wednesday evenings during Lent, when we'll gather together at 6pm in the Lounge to watch each film in its entirety, followed by a brief discussion about the spiritual content in each. If you're unable to join us on Wednesday evenings, but still want to view the films, you're invited to host a viewing party at your house. Welcome some friends over, share a meal together, and use the free study guide (available for pick up at the Welcome Desk) to discuss the central message of each film.

Of course, it wouldn't be Lent if I didn't have a book to recommend to you. So, in the spirit of our movie theme, I invite you to pick up a copy of God in the Movies: A Guide for Exploring Four Decades of Film. This book is a collection of writings on forty popular, secular movies that span the years since 1980. The book's contributors are various members of the

Reel Spirituality Institute at Fuller Theological Seminary. Now, this year's Lenten "devotional" isn't one in the traditional sense of the word. I chose it as an alternative to a more traditional resource, because I felt it provided an opportunity for us to explore our faith by watching familiar titles. However, I know that not all of the films in this book are suitable for all audiences. So, I encourage you to look up movie ratings and plot synopses before viewing any movie, especially if you'll be accompanied by younger viewers. I know that none of the movies in this book are perfect, nor are the people who created them. But I also know that some of the best stories of God's redemption begin with fairly broken characters. Sometimes we see glimpses of God where we least expect. Books are available for \$10 at the Welcome Desk.

Pastor Sara and I hope you'll join us for Sunday worship and movie nights on Wednesdays this Lent. We hope you'll bring a friend or two, too!

Creating a Legacy Of Generosity by Pastor Sara Isbell

You really have created a legacy of generosity here at Wesley Church, and we thank you. Your financial faith commitments and your prayer commitments for 2020 have been extraordinarily generous and encouraging, and set the pace for our missions and ministry in the coming year.

As you may have read in the January newsletter, this congregation committed to pray for Wesley's growth, inclusion of all people, and special welcome to young people in the coming year. I'm pretty excited about that. And you committed your financial support, to the tune of \$1,020,399 (One million, twenty thousand, three hundred ninety-nine). That's absolutely amazing. Thank you, Wesley Church. Thank you for your faith, hope and love, and your willingness to invest in Wesley's witness to our children, our community, and our world.

Now, we believe in full transparency, and so I also need to tell you that even the extraordinary generosity of \$1M fell about \$200,000 short of what we had planned for and what our leaders had asked for. For many weeks the Finance Committee worked to reduce that deficit: trimming back budget requests where we could, and seeking out options for potential flexibility – for example, because of your generosity we ended 2019 with a \$12,000 surplus. That's money we can carry into this year. We received an undesignated estate gift, a legacy of generosity someone left for us – and we've included some of that fund in this year's balance.

After making as many adjustments as we feel we can, we still show some deficit in our budget planning – about \$80,000, or 6% of the budget. But to be honest, a 94%-funded budget is no small blessing, and your Finance Committee and Administrative Council have both voted unanimously to step out in faith and approve that balance, to encourage faithful stewardship, to pray for God's continued abundance, and to bring you an updated report in June, to let you know how it's going.

If you have not yet had a chance to make your commitment, we hope you will do so; the Legacy of Generosity brochures are available at the Welcome Center and entrances to the church. If you have made a commitment, we sincerely thank you from the bottom of our hearts. We wouldn't be where we are today without you. Thanks so much, Wesley Church, for all you do to show and share the love of God in so many ways. Together we are a wonderful witness to amazing grace!
