Sermon

*Ready for Anything* Rev. Vaughn Hoffman Service of Covenant Renewal

Brothers and sisters in Christ, the Christian life is redeemed from sin and consecrated to God. Through baptism, we have entered this life and have been admitted into the new covenant of which Jesus Christ is the Mediator. He sealed it with his own blood, that it might last forever. On the one side, God promises to give us new life in Christ, the Source and Perfecter of our faith. On the other side, we are pledged to live no more for ourselves but only for Jesus Christ, who loved us and gave himself for us. From time to time we renew our covenant with God, especially when we reaffirm the Baptismal Covenant and gather at the Lord's table. Today, however, we meet, as the generations before us have met, On the first Sunday of the new year, to renew the covenant that binds us to God. Let us make this covenant of God our own.

#### Invitation

Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants. Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him. Christ has many services to be done. Some are easy, others are difficult. Some bring honor, others bring reproach. Some are suitable to our natural inclinations and desires, others are contrary to both. In some decisions we may please Christ and please ourselves. In others ,we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves. It is altogether fitting then, that we pause on this first Sunday of the new year, and offer anew our commitment to be servants of Christ. Let us pray:

I am no longer my own but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt; put me to doing; put me to suffering; let me be employed for thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee; let me be full, let me be empty; let me have all things, let me have nothing; I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Thou are mine and I am Thine. So be it, and may the covenant I make this day be ratified in heaven. Amen.
